Practical Details

Drinks – There will be water, squash, tea, herbals and coffee available free of charge throughout the event.

Then, after completing a doctorate in Old Testament economic ethics, he was ordained in the Anglican Church in 1977 and served as an assistant pastor in Tonbridge.

In 1988 he returned to the UK as Academic Dean at All Nations Christian College (an international training centre for cross-cultural mission) and then as Principal in 1993. In 2001 he was appointed International Director of the Langham Partnership.
